Pottawatomie County 4-H Public Presentation Award Application

A 4-H Public Presentation can be a demonstration, project talk or an illustrated talk. It should teach a skill, concept, or principle. Applicants are encouraged to present to groups outside your 4H club along with make different presentations throughout the year. Qualifying presentations for this award are not limited to those given before a judge but applicants are encouraged to participate in events such as County Club Days with a presentation. Presentation must have been given in the current 4H year, Oct 1st. Sept 30th.

OBJECTIVES of this award:

- To recognize 4-H'ers who present their presentation(s) a number of different times and increase their proficiency in making a public presentation.
- To share things learned in the 4-H program thereby promoting 4-H Public Speaking Program and the 4-H program.

Application:

Submit to your Leader the completed 3 page application, which includes: 1. this signature page, 2. the following table containing the summary of your presentations, and 3. narrative explaining your favorite presentation. The narrative should include, but is not limited to, why you gave that presentation, what the presentation was about, what you learned from doing that presentation, why you chose your audience and what you think your audience learned from your presentation

Type of Presentation:

Demonstration: Defined as a "show-how" process involving doing or making something while giving an explanation. The demonstrator uses actual items, supplies, equipment, people or animals while going through a process. There is usually a finished product to show, but is not required. A demonstration is a teaching method designed to teach specifically.

Project Talk: Defined as a short talk about one of your projects. It should: 1.Tell about your experience in the project. 2. Give some information relating to it. 3. Promote the project. The best project talk does all of these things.

Illustrated Talk: Defined as a "tell-how" process where the presenter uses visual aids such as posters, models, power points, etc to aid in emphasizing a point or to add interest while telling how to do something. An illustrated talk is a teaching method designed to teach specifically.
