Homemade Glass Cleaner Ingredients

1 cup rubbing alcohol

1 cup water

1 tablespoon vinegar

Using isopropyl alcohol and white vinegar together makes a quickly evaporating spray glass and mirror cleaner that competes with national brands. This can also be used to give a nice shine to hard tiles, chrome, and other surfaces.

Borax is one of the most useful product ingredients for making homemade stain removers and has several different options and directions for use in laundry on the box. One teaspoon of borax mixed with a teaspoon each of <u>white vinegar</u> and lemon juice will make a homemade stain remover that effectively removes ink and many food stains from most color-safe fabrics.

Baking soda mixed with water to form a paste makes an excellent homemade stain remover for perspiration stains on clothing. A saltwater mixture is also an effective pre-soak for heavily soiled clothes. Another version of homemade stain removers that can be effective as a spot remover for delicate fabrics is three tablespoons of <u>hydrogen</u> peroxide mixed with one tablespoon of <u>ammonia</u>. This mixture should not be made in any larger quantity and should be discarded after use.

STAIN REMOVER

Recipe #1

1/2 Cup Ammonia1/2 Cup White Vinegar2 Tablespoons Liquid Laundry Detergent (Use <u>HomeMade</u>)2 Quarts Water

Mix well, and store in spray bottle. *Hint - Reuse your "Spray and Wash" bottle.

Recipe #2

1/2 Cup Ammonia1/2 Cup Liquid Laundry Detergent1/2 Cup White Vinegar1/2 Cup Water

Mix well, and store in spray bottle. *Hint - Reuse your "Spray and Wash" bottle.

Recipe #3

1/4 Cup Borax or Washing Soda 2 Cups Cold Water

Sponge on and let dry, or soak the fabric in Borax mixture before washing in soap and cold water.

Recipe #4

For Heavily Stained Clothing

****NOTE:** This is for use with white cotton, nylon and polyester only.

1/2 Cup Liquid Laundry Detergent (Use HomeMade)

1/2 Cup Electric Dishwasher Detergent

1/2 Cup Non-Chlorinated Bleach or Ammonia, Not Both

Soak clothes in washing machine overnight or until stains disappear. Launder as usual.

You can also use these products alone to remove stains: Plain White Vinegar Hydrogen Peroxide Fels Naptha Castile Soap
